

Beginning in September, a select group of people will embark on a ten-month odyssey through the inner workings of the Greater Concord area. Their travels will take them from its beginnings as a small town by the railroad tracks to the city it is today—and identify what’s being done to prepare for the future.

Along the way, the Leadership Greater Concord Class of 2011 will poke their noses into the activities that make Concord tick: they’ll ride “shot-gun” with a police officer, go back to school for a day, visit the Merrimack County jail, spend a morning in court, sit in on an editorial meeting at the Concord Monitor, attend a legislative hearing, visit one or more businesses, and get involved in activities that offer insights into the Greater Concord area.

Beginning with a retreat, the program is a series of day-long sessions focusing on important aspects of civic life in Greater Concord. Using Concord and the surrounding towns as the “classroom,” the sessions are designed to offer first-hand information from—and dialogue with—leaders of businesses, organizations, and government.

By the end of the program, participants will know more about Greater Concord than most—and they’ll have the tools and contacts they need to better contribute to the quality of life in the Greater Concord community.

## WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Individuals who have a commitment to the community and are likely to assume greater responsibility in the future are encouraged to apply. A selection committee will conduct interviews of prospective participants. The participants chosen will ideally include those from business, government, education, civic groups, the arts, religion and community groups. The class is representative of the Greater Concord area in nature and balance is important to foster a greater understanding and knowledge of the community.

## Session 1: RETREAT

September 10 & 11, 2010

The program begins with a facilitated overnight retreat acquainting you with your classmates and the program—you’ll learn what to expect and how to maximize your experience.

## Session 2: HISTORY, CULTURE & THE ARTS

September 22, 2010

This day offers a historical overview of Concord as well as introducing you to the cultural venues and opportunities that make Greater Concord a great place to live and do business.

## Session 3: ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

October 13, 2010

This day offers a unique view into the environmental issues facing our communities as they relate to economic growth.

## Session 4: LIVABLE COMMUNITIES & SMART GROWTH

November 10, 2010

This day focuses on how Concord attracts business and plans economic development, balancing that with smart growth, livability and visioning.

## Session 5: COMMUNICATION & THE MEDIA

December 8, 2010

This session offers presentations, discussion and interactive role-playing with newspaper, radio, television, internet and other communication professionals.

## Session 6: CRIMINAL JUSTICE

January 12, 2011

This session will provide you with a better understanding of the criminal justice system. You will visit a courtroom and a correctional facility. Lawyers, police officers, and others from the criminal justice system will share their thoughts, experiences and predictions about the system.

## Session 7: GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS

February 9, 2011

You will learn the relationship between local, county and state government by attending legislative hearings and participating in candid and interactive conversations with local and state political leaders.

## Session 8: EDUCATION

March 9, 2011

You will be acquainted with the tough decisions made by educators as they grapple with issues they face daily, and visit area schools to meet the people making those decisions.

## Session 9: HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES

April 13, 2011

This session offers you an opportunity to learn more about the health and human service resources in Greater Concord and have a better understanding of the delivery of those services and the challenges faced as Greater Concord grows.

## Session 10: REFLECTIONS AND MOVING FORWARD

May 11, 2011

This day has two parts: the first focuses on your inner self—what do you do to re-fuel, how do you balance all you do, and what spirituality means to you. In the second part of the day, you will revisit your Leadership experiences and have a better understanding of how you can use them to accomplish your goals.
